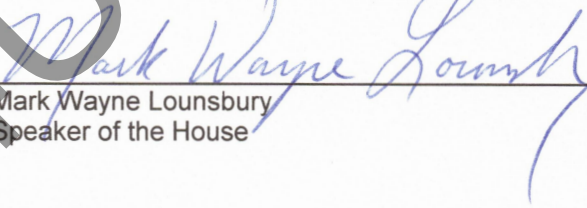

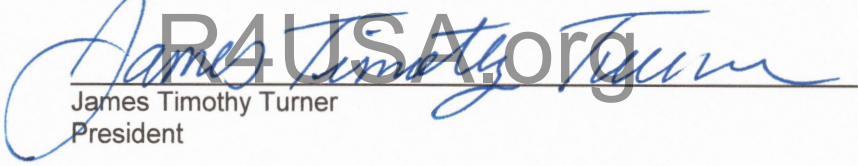

Military Communications Act of 2012

SECTION I: Purpose and Title

The purpose of this Act is to authorize the President of the Republic for the United States of America to have communications with the military during this time of re-inhabitation. This Act may be cited as the "Military Communications Act of 2012."

SECTION II: Findings

Whereas, the President of the Republic for the United States of America is not in the capacity of the Commander in Chief of the military in times of peace, and

Whereas, this is not an authorization to attack any group or nation, and

Whereas, from time to time, in the act of re-inhabitation of the *de jure* Republic, the President may need to have communications with the military in order to coordinate the re-inhabitation, therefore.

SECTION III: Authorization of Communications with the Military

Be it enacted, by the Republic for the United States of America in Congress Assembled, the President is hereby authorized, during the re-inhabitation period, to have open communication with the Joint Chiefs of Staff and heads of the military branches for the protection of the American people and the re-inhabitation process.
